

**PUBLIC HEARING OF THE VILLAGE OF ANGELICA BOARD OF TRUSTEES
INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2012, TO BE IDENTIFIED AS LOCAL LAW NO. 1
OF 2013 ENTITLED "A LOCAL LAW TO ESTABLISH A CURFEW AFFECTING PERSONS
UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS IN THE VILLAGE OF ANGELICA"

Mayor Robbins called the Public Hearing to order at 7:03pm.

The Mayor explained how the proposed local law would operate and the reasons why the Board of Trustees is considering adopting it.

Opposed to adopting Local Law:

Leslie Haggstrom – Supreme Court ruling in the City of Rochester found curfews unconstitutional
Paul Hollier – passing a law doesn't change children's behavior
Chuck Dorsey – not fair to all other children
Skip Hecker – majority of children are well mannered
Sherri Presutti – curfew not the answer
Dave Beers – other options – i.e. post hours of Park Circle
Deb Staffieri – being found unconstitutional possible courts cost on village

Those supporting the adopting of the Local Law:

Chris Baker – help community dealing with certain issues
Barb Broughton – parent held accountable and supports the safety of our children
Bart Hannon – Police Department needs the tool to send children home so issues don't arise – other cities' curfew laws have been challenged and held – research curfews that have held in courts
Michael Burke – can try and review after a period of time
Fred Grusendorf – if children out for a purpose don't see the law will affecting them – do it on a trial basis and review

Officer In Charge – Shawn Grusendorf – understands that there are two sides to this – tried dealing with the problems within their budget – this will allow them another tool which he believes will help stay within his budget. Not doing this to go around and arrest kids. Open for suggestions on what else can be done.

Attorney David Pullen this law will give the police department the ability to take kids home before things have a chance to occur. Researched the City of Rochester case. Suggests if interested in adopting the curfew local law recommends making the law stronger. Need to add in reason why

you believe the law is needed – stating incidents that have occurred during the curfew hours and the support of the public in favor of the local law.

With no further questions asked Trustee Weaver declared the public hearing closed at 8:00pm – second Trustee Baker – Robbins-Aye, Baker-Aye, Weaver-Aye, Young-Aye, McKnight-Aye – carried.
